Obituary—Clarence D. Long

Clarence D. Long, son of George and Phoebe Long, was born May 11, 1877, died May 2, 1934, at the age of 56 years, 11 months and 22 days.

He was born about five miles west of Baxter and resided near there all his life with the exception of three years spent in Oklahoma.

On August 22, 1900, he was united in marriage to Gay Hardenburgh, and to this union six children were born, all of whom are living except Burnard, who died in youth.

The children living are Mrs. Ruth Neely of New Hampton, Iowa; Eldon and Roland of Collins, Iowa; Raymond of Colo, Iowa, and Lorraine who is at home.

When just a young man Mr. Long united with the Protestant Methodist church and although he made no loud profession he was a man to demand respect and was always a hard worker and a good home supporter. The welfare of his family and loved ones was ever uppermost in his mind.

For about a year and a half prior to his death he had been failing in health and about two weeks ago he was put to bed, in the hopes that with rest and medical aid he would soon be about again, but fate willed otherwise and though he had the best help and care obtainable he passed out of this world of pain and strife to that home beyond where all is peace.

Besides his wife and children he leaves to mourn the loss one brother James of near Baxter, two sisters, Mrs. Pearl Hardenburgh of Baxter and Mrs. Lillian Tramel of Des Moines, eight grandchildren and a host of relatives and friends.
