

Death of Paul V. Malloy

Mrs. A. L. Pitcher received word Sunday of the death of her brother, Paul V. Malloy, of Newport Beach, Calif., who was injured in an automobile accident New Year's day, and died Jan. 3.

Mr. Malloy was born at Van Cleve, Iowa, July 12, 1892, the son of Martin D. and Esther J. Malloy. When a small boy the family moved to Marshalltown, where he was graduated from high school in 1911. Following two years at Iowa State college, he and his parents moved to a claim near Bixby, S. D. In 1919 he married Miss Mayme Titus of Cedar Canyon, S. D. For the next 15 years Mr. Malloy and his father were engaged in building roads for the state. Following two years as relief director for five counties in South Dakota, the family moved to Newport Beach, where he has since been employed as foreman in a fish cannery.

Mr. and Mrs. Malloy were the parents of three sons, who with their mother survive. Besides Mrs. Pitcher, he leaves two other sisters, Mrs. J. J. Croughan of Balboa, Calif., and Mrs. Leo Harris of Armstrong, Ia. J. E. Malloy of State Center is an uncle.

Funeral services were held in Newport Beach Tuesday at 10 a. m. Owing to the illness of Mrs. Pitcher neither she nor Mrs. Harris, who is caring for her, were able to attend.
