William (Bill) August Martsching

Aug. 19, 1920, to June 26, 2003

William (Bill) August Martsching, 82, of Ames, died of renal failure and congestive heart failure.

He was born Aug. 19, 1920, in Keokuk Township, Wapello County, on Aug. 19, 1920, to Frederick William and Lurena Belle (Edblom) Martsching. He attended Hubler School. He served in the United States Army during World War II. He married Treva LaVonne Marks in Ottumwa on Mother's Day, May 14, 1944. He farmed southeast of Ottumwa for 12 years. In 1958, he moved to Ames where he worked as a carpenter. After retirement, he spent many volunteer hours helping the Iowa Missouri Conference of Seventh-day Adventist, his home church in Ames and Ankeny Christian Academy in Ankeny. He was a member of the Ames Seventh-day Adventist Church and the American Legion Post 37. His life was surrounded with the love of church family and a host of friends.
