Death of Mrs. Sam Dunahoo

Mrs. Hattie McCord and son Verle, Mrs. Dollie Brouhard and Claude Shickell attended the funeral, Sunday morning at Blairsburg, of Mrs. Sam Dunahoo, pioneer of that community and sister-in-law of J. W. McCord of Collins. Mrs. Dunahoo's death occurred Friday morning.

The funeral services were held Sunday morning at 11 at Blairsburg, after which the funeral party drove to Iowa Center and interment was made in Evergreen cemetery.

Louisa Cordelia (Goodman); Dunahoo was born April 23, 1864 in Franklin county, N. Y., and died January 18, 1929 at Blairsburg, Ia., aged 64 years 8 months and 25 days.

She came to Iowa with her parents, Palemon and Margaret Goodnow, when she was a little girl. Her girlhood days were spent in Shelby and Story counties.

She was united in marriage to W. S. Dunahoo of Story county, Sept. 14, 1881. To this union were born three children: Nellie Ayres of Blairsburg, Mary Kurtz of Atkin, Minn.; Margaret McKee of Blairsburg.

Mr. and Mrs. Dunahoo lived in or near Iowa Center until 1921 when they moved to Blairsburg. They had joined the Evangelical church of Iowa Center about forty-five years ago, so it was not strange to find them transferring their memberships and taking part in the work of the church in that place.

Mrs. Dunahoo's life was a living testimony of the reality of that miracle of miracles, the new birth. The great truth that Jesus saves was the keynote of her life and her teachings in the Sunday school.

Besides the three children she leaves three brothers: Ely of Algona, Milton J. of Des Moines and LeRoy of Colo. Mr. Dunahoo preceded her in

death Oct. 7, 1925. Seven grandchildren, one great grandchild and many friends remain to mourn the loss of a sainted mother and sister who could break the spiritual bread of life among them.
