Lois Marguerite Pfeiffer, 77, died Monday, March 4, of cancer in Ozark, Mo.

She was born April 5, 1924, in Fernald to John and Sarah (Bovender) Myers. She graduated from Shipley High School in 1942 and married Delbert Pfeiffer on July 27, 1967. She was a cook in the Auburn School for 16 years and retired in 1983. She also owned and operated an antique store in Auburn between 1967 and 1985. She enjoyed sewing and continued her love of antiquing.
