

FATAL ACCIDENT NEAR FERNALD, SATURDAY EVENING

Bruce Miller, 21, was killed early Saturday evening when the Ford roadster in which he was driving went into the ditch and turned over near the George Buffington home, about three and a half miles east of Fernald.

Short funeral services were held at 11:30 o'clock today at the boy's home here with the Rev. Burkhart of the Christian church of zearing, in charge. Funeral services and burial will be at Dahlgren, Ill.

Two sons of Mr. and Mrs. Buffington found the body about 7:30 p. m. Saturday. Miller's neck was broken.

He had been employed during the day at the home of Bud Miller, an uncle, near Colo, and was returning to the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. L. B. Miller, east of Farrar, when the accident occurred. It is believed that the lights on his auto suddenly burned out and the car went off the grade before he could stop. Darkness and drizzling rain also were probable contributing factors to the tragedy.

The deceased is survived by his parents, four brothers, Lyle, Vernon, George and Wayne, and one sister, Eva.
