Merle V. Nolta, 83, of 203 4th St. NE in State Center, died early Wednesday morning, April 3, at the Iowa Veterans Home.

Funeral services were held on Saturday, April 6 at St. Paul Lutheran Church in State Center with Pastor Ronald Darge officiating. Burial followed at the Hillside Cemetery. Flag presentation service was provided by the Harlan Pfantz Post of the American Legion.

Nolta was born in State Center on July 28, 1918, the son of Gerald and Ildra Weuve Nolta.

He was united in marriage to Helen Eckhart in 1938.
