After earning his Bachelor's of Science degree in Mechanical Engineering from Iowa State University, he married Irma Evans on September 4, 1949 in Ottumwa, Iowa. He lived his entire adult life in Marshalltown, moving here in 1949, where he spent his professional career with Fisher Controls until his retirement in 1983. He was a dedicated family man who enjoyed fishing, building furniture, tracing geneological histories, and passing on his knowledge to future generations. He was a long standing member of the American Legion and the National Order of Battlefield Commissions.
