Services Held Saturday for Barry Randall

MELBOURNE — Barry Randall, 24, of Melbourne, was killed early Thursday, Jan. 29 when he apparently fell asleep at the wheel of his car. He was headed east on Highway 330, one-tenth mile outside of Marshalltown and approaching a curve to the north, when his car left the road and rolled down a steep embankment. Randall was thrown from the car.

A passenger, Dennie Gould, 25, of Liscomb, remained in the car and received only bumps and bruises.

Services were held Saturday at St. Joseph's Catholic Church in State Center, where Randall was a member. Burial was in the St. Joseph's Cemetery in Rhodes.

Mr. Randall was born Apr. 8, 1951, to Stanley C. and Jeanne Malloy Randall. He graduated in 1969 from West Marshall High School, and had been employed at Fisher Controls Co., Marshalltown.

He is survived by his parents, a maternal grandmother, Mrs. Loretta Malloy, Rhodes; paternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence (Shorty) Randall, Melbourne; five brothers, Ben and Randy, rural Melbourne; Matthew, Waterloo, and Stanley L. and Todd, at home; and a sister, Mrs. James (Laurie) Buck, Melbourne.

He was preceded in death by a sister in infancy and his maternal grandfather.
