

# Richeson Funeral Conducted Sunday At State Center

*Died 2 Aug 1944*

Funeral service was held Monday afternoon in the Brimhall and West funeral home in State Center for G. W. Richeson, 52. Interment was in Eden cemetery, Rhodes.

Wright Richeson was born on the old Richeson homestead north of Rhodes June 25, 1889. He grew to manhood there and married Miss Eva Burch, of Melbourne, September 19, 1912. They made their home east of town and were the parents of six children, one of whom, Kenneth, died in infancy.
