Jim Richeson Dies Wednesday At Age Of 67

STATE CENTER — (Special) Ozro (Jim) Richeson 67, died Wednesday morning at his home here. He has been in failing health for two years.

MR. RICHESON was born Feb. 28, 1898, the son of George and Belle Boot Richeson, four miles south of State Center. He was educated in the Rhodes community. On Jan. 5, 1922, he was married to Elmyra Wenge at Marshalltown. They farmed south of State Center before moving into town in 1931. He operated a tank truck service route and a school bus route for more than 30 years. Mr. Richeson retired in 1963.

He was a veteran of World War I, enlisting on May 28, 1918, at Fort Logan, Colo., and serving in the medical department of the U. S. Army. He was honorably discharged Sept. 1, 1919, at Hot Springs, Ark.

SURVIVING BESIDES the widow are two sons, Daryl of Williams and Duane of Cedar Rapids; a foster son, James Remer of San Antonio, Texas; a brother, D. F. Richeson, State Center; a sister, Mrs. Dorothy Herring of Chester, Pa., and 10 grandchildren. He was preceded in death by two sisters and six brothers.

Services will be held at 2 p. m. Friday, at the Wensell-Perrin Funeral Home here with the Rev. L. R. Meinecke in charge and burial in the Rose Hill Memorial Gardens. Committal services will be in charge of Harland G. Pfantz No. 122 American Legion Post.
