RHODES PIONEER DEAD.

Alonzo Richmond Succumbs to Heart Disease After Long Sickness.

Alonzo Richmond, 72, a resident of the Rhodes neighborhood since 1868, died at 3 o'clock Tuesday afternoon at his home in Rhodes of heart disease with which he had been ill all winter.

Mr. Richmond was born in Hicksville, N. Y., Jun. 27, 1850, and came to Marshall county when 18 years old and settled near Rhodes. He

was united in marriage Sept. 18, 1872 at Nevada to Amanda Beard. Nine children were born to them, seven of whom survive with Mrs. Richmond. The children are Mrs. Minnie Leible, Melbourne; Mrs. Hattie Williams, State Center; Mrs. Wilda Southfield, Collins; Mrs. Flora Glaudemman, Billings, Mont.; Mrs. Nellie Clark, Libby, Mont., and Mrs. Maude Hale, and Earl Richmond, Rhodes. Five sisters also are living. Mr. Richmond was a member of the Odd Fellows lodge at Rhodes.

The funeral will be at 2 Thursday afternoon at the Methodist church in charge of the Odd Fellows. Burial will be in Eden cemetery.
