#### **Local man dies early Tuesday of heart attack**

**Death claims Walter Riemenschneider at 2:30 Tuesday morning**  
**March 31, 1932 *State Center Enterprise* (Vol. 61, # 13, P. 1, Col. 2)**

Walter L. Riemenschneider died at 2:30 Tuesday morning at his home in this city from a heart attack with which he was stricken Monday evening. Although he had been ailing for a couple of weeks he was about town Monday and was at the office all day where he was engaged in the livestock business with his brother, William, for a number of years. He went home at about 7:00 o'clock and two hours later a doctor was called.

Mr. Riemenschneider was born in State Center on September 14, 1892, and grew to manhood here. He was baptized and confirmed in St. Paul's Lutheran church, of which he has been a member since that time. On August 27, 1920 he was united in marriage to Miss Selma Marlow. Two of the three children born to this union survive their father. They are Howard and William, both living at home. His widow and mother, Mrs. Josephine Riemenschneider, as well as his brother William, all of State Center, also survive.

Mr. Riemenschneider served his country in the World War and was an active member of Harland G. Pfantz Post of the American Legion of this city.

Funeral services will be held from the home at 1:30 Thursday afternoon, and at 2 o'clock from St. Paul's Lutheran church, with Rev. A.H. Schultz in charge. The American Legion will take charge of the service at the grave. Burial will be in Hillside cemetery.
