Glenn E. Robinson, 30, Rhodes farmer, died at a Des Moines hospital at 3 a. m. Sunday from a skull fracture suffered in an automobile accident, according to an Associated Press dispatch from Des Moines.

Coroner A. E. Shaw said Robinson also suffered rib injuries and a compound fracture of the right arm in the accident which occurred Saturday night when his car collided with two other cars on a Des Moines street.

Traffic Patrolman Virgil E. Thompson said Robinson's car sideswiped a Ruan Transport company gasoline truck, forcing the truck almost off the street. Merle E. Foreen, 40, driver of the truck, was unhurt.

Robinson's car caromed off the truck and struck two other cars that were following the truck. They were driven by Leonard W. Malloy, 32, of Altoona, and Loren E. Atkinson, 29, of Bondurant.

Robinson was thrown out of his car onto the pavement, Highway Patrolman N. B. Wilson, who arrived a few minutes after the collision, reported. Wilson said a charge of driving while intoxicated which he filed against Robinson Saturday night would be dismissed.

Robinson had had his driver's license less than two months, the license having been suspended, Wilson said, when the officer filed a previous charge of driving while intoxicated Dec. 30, 1943. That case was ignored by the Polk county grand jury on Jan. 24 and Robinson's driving privileges were restored at that time, Wilson explained.
