Along with his furniture, library, etc., he shipped his driving team, a colt, and his jersey cow The Dr. will practice the profession of medicine immediately after he gets out of the confusion of unpacking and is ready for business. Mrs. Sanders will stay in Collins for a time, or until her successor as postmaster is appointed and takes charge of the postoffice.
