

# FORMER POST- MISTRESS DIES

Mrs. John P. Satterfield Passed Away  
at Her Home Here Last Friday  
Afternoon

Mrs. John Satterfield, former Rhodes postmistress, died about 4:30 o'clock Friday afternoon at her home here following a stroke. Her death came as a shock to the family and the community. She had been in failing health but was quite improved the past few weeks.

Mrs. Satterfield was born Carrie Louise Stewart, daughter of William and Jane Stewart, at Franklin Grove, Ill., Aug. 6, 1859. She grew to womanhood in that community and was married there to Mr. Satterfield March 12, 1884. They lived at Franklin Grove and at O'Neill, Nebr., for a few years and came to the Rhodes community 47 years ago, living on a farm near here a short time and then moving to town. She was a member of Crystal Chapter No. 11 O. E. S. of Rhodes and the Methodist church.

Mrs. Satterfield assisted her husband when he was in charge of the Rhodes postoffice from 1900 to 1906 and then she received the appointment herself, serving from 1906 to 1914, and served the public well.

Besides Mr. Satterfield, she is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Mildred Miles of State Center, and two brothers, Albert J. Stewart of Franklin Grove, Ill., and Will Stewart of Seattle, Wash. A son, Earl, died June 12, 1916, and three sisters preceded her in death.

Funeral services were held Monday afternoon, a prayer service at the home at 1:30 followed by services at the Methodist church at 2:00 o'clock in charge of Rev. Dwight Osgood of Nevada assisted by Rev. C. A. Crouse. Music was furnished by a quartet composed of Mrs. G. P. Buck, Mrs. Ray Murray, David Buck and Luther Hix, with Miss Agnes Buck pianist. Flowers were cared for by Mrs. Clifford West, Mrs. Brimhall, Mrs. Grace Wendel, Mrs. Leo Perry and Mrs. Nina Baker. Pall bearers were Leo Perry, Harold Robinson, Glenn Robinson, Willard Thursby, W. I. Mead and LeRoy Mallicoat. Interment was in Eden cemetery.
