Gerald S. "Bud" Schauper, Sr., 75, of Maxwell, died Sunday, Aug. 11, at his home from a heart ailment.

He was born Nov. 27, 1926, in Collins, to Esther (Hall) and Harold Schauper, Sr. He married Bonnie Bowen on April 4, 1948, at the Presbyterian Church in Maxwell. He graduated from the Maxwell High School. He served in the Army Air Corps during WWII and in the Occupational Army in Japan, where he helped build an airstrip. He also worked with Schauper and Son Kaiser-Fraser Car Dealership in Maxwell, John Deere, farmed in the Radcliff area between 1952 and 1968, was assistant mail carrier for 22 years, and also worked at Maytag in Newton for 36 years, retiring in 1988. He was an associate member of the Maxwell Presbyterian Church. He enjoyed fishing, farming, mechanical work, motor sports and yard work.

Survivors include his wife, Bonnie, of Maxwell; a son, Gerald "Jerry" Schauper of Rockwell City; a daughter, Jeanie (and Stephen) Birchmier of Maxwell; five grandchildren; five great-grandsons; and two sisters: Jeanette Smith of Salina, Okla., and Evelyn Harding of Newton.

His parents and two brothers, Robert Schauper and Harold Schauper, preceded him in death.

Funeral services were held Wednesday, Aug. 14, at the Maxwell Area Community Center with Pastor Keith McDonald officiating. Burial was in the Maxwell Cemetery.
