

MRS. EMMA SHENKLE

Mrs. Emma Shenkle, 84, one of the pioneer women of the Collins neighborhood died Saturday.

The funeral services were held Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Collins Methodist church, with Rev. Hohanshelt, a former pastor

now of Waukee, in charge. Burial was in the family lot in the Collins cemetery.

She was born at Higginsville, Onedia county, N. Y., September 23, 1851, a daughter of Justice and Katheryn Richmond. The family came to Story county in 1868 and settled on the old homestead. The father gave the land for the Willow Creek school and also for one of the first township roads in the community.

Emma Richmond was married to John Shenkle on Christmas day 1870. The husband died February 6, 1922. One daughter, Mrs. Mary Tribby died in 1908, leaving her daughters Ethel and Mable and they were raised in the home of the grandparents.

She leaves Frank Shenkle of north of Collins, Mrs. Bertha Stuntz of Collins, William Shenkle of Baxter, E. H. Shenkle of Sioux Falls, S. D., and Blanch Van Dran of Kewanee, Ill., besides 23 grandchildren and ten great grandchildren. She also leaves four sisters, Mrs. Sarah Sheldon, 94, of Iowa Falls, Mrs. Susan Kelley of Manchester, Mrs. Ida Miller of Oregon, and Mrs. Ellen Day of Washington.
