IN REMEMBRANCE

Mrs. Mildred Tuttle, age 86, of Rhodes, died Aug. 20, at the State Center Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in State Center.

Funeral services were set for 10:30 a.m. Aug. 24 at the Rhodes United Methodist Church, with Pastor Elsa Lawry officiating. Burial followed at the Eden Cemetery in Rhodes.

She was born on Oct. 30, 1915 in Osceola, IA., the daughter of Allen and Motto Lena Miller Smith.

On June 7, 1936 she was united in marriage to James H. Tuttle in Missouri; he preceded her in death on Jan. 7, 1996.

Surviving are five sons and two daughters: Richard (Donna) Tuttle, of Albert Lea, Minn.; Karen Marie Groves, of Kellogg; Jerry (Shirley) Tuttle, of Wellsburg; Judith Ann, Mrs. Wayne Schroder, of Davenport; Ronald (Beth) Tuttle, of Melbourne; Danny J. (Diana) Tuttle, of State Center; and George "Skeeter" (Barb) Tuttle of Rhodes.

Also surviving are 26 grandchildren and 47 great-grandchildren.

There are two brothers and one sister surviving; Lavere Smith, of Phoenix, Ariz.; Dick Smith, of Davenport; and Linda Reed, of Osceola.

Reared and educated in Osceola, she graduated from high school there. Following their marriage, they farmed in the Murray, IA. area until moving to the Rhodes area in 1956. She made her home there until moving to the State Center Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in 1995. After moving to the Rhodes area she had been employed by the State Center Manor, Donnelley Manufacturing and the Marshall County Care Facility, from which she retired. Mildred was a member of the Rhodes United Methodist Church and the Rhodes United Methodist Women.
