Adaline Flanna Snyder, daughter of Solomon and Catherine Snyder, was born in Crawford county, Penn., August 16, 1851, and died at her home near Mingo, April 9, 1930. The end came after only a few hours illness.

She came with her parents to Iowa in 1858, where she lived the remainder of her life with the exception of a few years spent in Nebraska.

On March 16, 1873 she was united in marriage to James P. Mullihan and to this union seven children were born: Emily, who preceded her in death, Mrs. Myrtle Bailey of Mingo, Mrs. Carrie Persun of Mitchellville, and four sons, John, Blaine, Ray and Ivan, all of Collins.

Mr. Mullihan died Jan. 8, 1905, and since that time Mrs. Mullihan has had the responsibility of the home and the care of the children until they established homes of their own.

For the last six years Blaine has faithfully cared for the mother.

Mrs. Mullihan was a good woman, loved devotedly by her children, respected and liked by all who knew her. Those who knew her best say, "If there is a Heaven, surely she is there."

Besides her children, she leaves to mourn her loss, sixteen grandchildren and six great grandchildren; one brother, Andrew Snyder; and three sisters, Mrs. Emeline Battles, Mrs. Mary Quaintence and Mrs. Della Robinson, all of Mitchellville; besides a host of other relatives and friends.

One sister, Mrs. Susie Gifford, and one brother, Ezeriah Snyder have passed on before her.

About a year ago she joined the Three-Quarter Century club of Jasper county and derived much pleasure from those associations.

The funeral services were held at the Santiago Methodist church, Friday, April 11, at 2 p. m., with the Rev. A. F. George in charge. Interment was in the Franklin cemetery near Santiago.
