

# MRS. ANNA BLINK

—"St. Patrick's" church was filled this morning by relatives and by friends gathered to attend the funeral rites for Mrs. Anna Blink, widow of the late George Blink, who died at her home at 724 10th street, on Thursday evening.

Services, which were held at 9:00 A. M. was in charge of the pastor Rev. Fr. Daniel E. Georman and following the rites at the church, the funeral cortege drove to Rhodes, where the body was laid to rest by the side of her late husband who died Feb. 21, 1936. Nephews of the deceased, who served as pallbearers were Clarence Mesha of Ames, Roy Switzer of Boone, Joe Rhiel of Churdan, William Blink of Rhodes, Edward Welp of Haverhill, and Glenn Scheiner of Correctionville.

Mrs. Blink whose maiden name was Anna Switzer, was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Solomon Switzer, pioneers of the Story City community. There she was born 73 years ago the coming June 7th. She was married to George Blink of the Rhodes community April 15, 1884, at St. Peter's and Paul's church southwest of Story City by Rev. Fr. Schulte and the golden wedding was celebrated in the home in Nevada April 15, 1934.

They first lived on a farm near Melbourne, but later they moved to a farm near Rhodes, from which place they moved to Marshalltown where the family home remained until 18 years ago when they moved to Nevada. Four years after moving to Nevada they built and established themselves in a fine and commodious new home on 10th st.

Of the seven children born to Mr. and Mrs. Blink, one daughter Rose, died about 30 years ago at the age of 14 years. Survivors, all of whom were here for the funeral were Chas. Blink of Scranton; Mary, Mrs. W. W. Delahoyde of Dawson; Joe Blink of Wilmont, S. D.; Cecelia, Mrs. I. Schaap of Omaha; Grace, Mrs. F. Bence of Bondurant; and one great grandchild. Brothers and sisters surviving are August Switzer of Boone, Mrs. John Scheiner of Correctionville, Mrs. Mesha of Ames, Theodor Switzer of Texas, and John Switzer of Des Moines. Interment was made in the Rhodes cemetery on Monday of this week.
