Will F. Tummel died Monday at Kansas City Former resident of State Center passes away after long illness May 11, 1939 State Center Enterprise

Word was received here early Monday that Will F. Tummel, brother of Mrs. Pauline Watson, and a former resident of State Center had passed away late Sunday at the home of his daughter, Mrs. R.L. Train in Kansas City. Mr. Tummel's death occurred upon his 82nd birthday. He had been ill for some time, having submitted to an operation in the early winter and never recovered.

Mr. Tummel was engaged in the mercantile business in State Center in years gone by, in partnership with his brother, the late John W. Tummel. He grew to manhood in this neighborhood.

The funeral services are being held today in Kansas City, with burial there.

Mr. Tummel's wife died about ten years ago. He leaves a son, William Tummel, who is a motion picture director in Hollywood, Calif., and two daughters, Mrs. Catherine Holden of Buenos Aires, Argentine Republic and Mrs. R.L. Train of Kansas City. Mrs. Watson is his only living sister and Mr. Tummel made an extended visit here last summer. He also visited twice with his daughter in South America and also twice with his son in Hollywood in recent years.
