Isabelle Gerke, 84, State Center, died Wednesday, Nov. 6, 2002 at the State Center Nursing and Rehabilitation Center.

Funeral services and a celebration of her life was held Saturday, Nov. 9 at the St. John Lutheran Church north of State Center with Rev. Mike Maddick officiating. She was laid to rest in the St. John Cemetery. The Wensel-Perrin Funeral Home was entrusted with her final arrangements.

Isabelle was a member of the St. John Lutheran Church, the ladies aid of the church, the State Center Senior Citizens, the Birthday group and some neighborhood clubs. She will be fondly remembered as a devoted wife and loving mother who dearly loved family, cooking, family gatherings and children. She will be greatly missed by all that knew and loved her.
