harlotte M. Vasey, 93, of
Ames, died Monday, Aug.
25 at the Northcrest Retirement
Community in Ames. Memorial

Charlotte Vasey was born in Collins to Arthur A. And Lena (Burney) Vasey, and lived there until she graduated from Collins Consolidated High School. She then attended Iowa State Teachers' College, graduating with a major in public school music. She taught in this field and elementary education until 1944. She then studied physical therapy at the Mayo Clinic and Nichols General Hospital in Louisville, Ky. Subsequently she practiced physical therapy in the University Hospitals in Iowa City until moving to Ames in 1969. At that time she substituted in both the Boone County and

Marshalltown Community
Hospitals. Later she participated in a program called "Reach," which taught recreation and exercise activities for the elderly conducted in the home. In June 1968 she received the Olive Farr award at the Iowa Physical Therapy State convention. She was a member of the Collegiate United Methodist Church, its Women's Fellowship, and Delta Zeta Alumnae.

She is survived by one nephew, Arthur Federer, and several cousins.

She was preceded in death by her parents and two sisters, Lillian Federer and Eileen Vasey.
