George R. Vasey, son of Rebecca and Richard Vasey was born near Scarsborough, Yorkshire, England, Nov. 11, 1853 and passed away at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Sam Westcott in Council Bluffs, Iowa, Aug. 24, 1946 at the age of 92 years, 9 mo. and 13 days.

When eight years of age he came to U. S. with his parents and other members of his family and settled at Jacksonville, Morgan Co. Ill.

On Dec. 24, 1873, he was united in marriage to Kitty Parlee Henson. To this union were born seven children—six daughters and one son. When the oldest child was 12 years of age, the mother passed away. In the spring of 1887 he came with his children and parents and settled on a farm south of Collins.

On Dec. 17, 1902, he was married to Mrs. Sadie Minear and they made their home on the farm until 1910. At that time he purchased a home in Collins, where he continued to reside until in failing health he was moved to his daughter's home in Council Bluffs, where he was given all the care that loving hands could bestow.

He was converted and joined the Methodist Church at Durbin, Ill., and was always a strong believer in his faith. His many deeds of kindness will be long remembered. He was a loving father and kind neighbor, and will be greatly missed by family and friends.
