

JOSEPH VASEY

Joseph Vasey, 77, died at his home at Collins Friday afternoon at 4:00, after an illness covering over a period of four months. He was born January 28, 1860, in Yorkshire, England, a son of Richard and Rebekah Anderson-Vasey. He came to the United States with his parents when a babe of one year, the family locating near Jacksonville, Ill.

When he was 29 years of age, he came out to Iowa and bought a farm south of Collins, where he lived for a number of years. He was married Oct. 26, 1902, to Charlotte Berry of the same community, and they continued to live upon the farm until 24 years ago when they retired and moved into Collins.

For the past six years or more Mr. Vasey had been an invalid. He leaves besides his wife, a brother George Vasey, 86, and a number of nephews and nieces.

Joseph Vasey, son of Richard and Rebecca Vasey, was born in Yorkshire, England, Jan. 27, 1860, and died at his home in Collins, Iowa, July 30, 1937. aged 77 years, 6 months and 3 days.

In 1861 the family came to America and founded a home near Jacksonville. Ill. Later they moved to Jasper county, Iowa.

In 1902 Joseph was married to Miss Charlotte Berry. For the past 24 years Mr. and Mrs. Vasey have lived in Collins, where they have many friends who sympathize with Mrs. Vasey in her bereavement. Besides his wife, Mr. Vasey leaves one brother, George, and many other relatives. His parents, two brothers and one sister preceded him in death.
