(Sadie) Minear nee McQuiston d. 1960

Obituary

Funeral services were held in the Christian church in Collins Tuesday afternoon for Mrs. Sarah E. Vasey who died at Kathy's Rest Home in Nevada Saturday, Feb. 6, 1960, having reached the age of 94 years, 3 months and 30 days. Rev. Robert McDonald officiated assisted by Rev. Randall Simms of Maxwell.

Kathleen Minear sang "Sweet Hour of Prayer," "In the Garden" and "Nearer My God to Thee." She was accompanied by Virginia Fertig at the organ.

Flowers were cared for by Gladys Wood and Leota Scott and casket bearers were Carlo Minear, James Rock, Theodore Minear, Marion Mullihan, James Mullihan, Harold Minear and Barry Minear.

Interment was in the Collins Evergreen cemetery in charge of the Cooper service of Maxwell.

Sarah E. McQuiston, one of a family of five boys and four girls was born to Perry and Catherine McQuiston in a log cabin south-east of Collins, October 7, 1865.

She grew to womanhood there and on Oct. 11, 1883 she was united in marriage to Marion E. Minear. To this union were born eight children namely Rollie J. who died at the age of two; Wesley Carl of Maxwell; Clifford of Wathena, Kansas; Eva Mullihan of Collins; Maggie DeBusk of Sunnyside, Washington; Flora Rock of Tucson, Arizona; Glen Minear and Harley Minear of Maxwell.

Mr. Minear preceded her in death and she later married George Vasey who also preceded her in death.

In 1902 Mrs. Vasey became a member of the Christian church in Collins, about five years after that organization became a cor-

porate group. Her life has been a long one full of varied interests.

Besides the seven children named she is survived by 22

grandchildren, 67 great-grandchildren and 8 great great grandchildren. She had been in failing health for four and a half years.
