MAXINE LAMPEL, 90

A long-time resident of Marshalltown, Maxine spent her last ten years in Winterset, Iowa, five years living with her son and daughter-in-law, David and Linda Lampel, followed by five years at the Care Center.

Maxine was born February 24, 1919, the daughter of Jessie Mae (Lutes) and Arthur Worden. Her family home was on North Third Avenue in Marshalltown. Brothers Floyd Irwin Glidden, Hollis Raymond Glidden, and Fred Donald Worden, and sister Norma Marguerite Glidden have all preceded her in death.

A life-long member of First Baptist Church in Marshalltown, she received Christ as her Lord at a young age, and was baptized in 1929. She graduated from Marshalltown High School in the Class of 1937, and remained active at their reunions so long as her health permitted.

During World War Two, Maxine worked as a Price Clerk (or Ration Officer) in the Office of Price Administration (OPA). On June 24, 1945, Maxine wed Alvin Louis Lampel, and they made their home on West Church Street. She remained there for twenty years after the death of her husband on May 17, 1979.

Mrs. Lampel was a full-time mother and homemaker, but also served for many years as a Red Cross Volunteer at the hospital, and was very active in her church family. She served as Cradle Roll Chairman, deaconess, sang in the choir and was a soloist in earlier years. her Mrs. Lampel was known for her hospitality and her bak-ing. Friends from church were always added around the table for Sunday dinner, where they enjoyed Maxine's home-baked rolls and bread, and a dessert of one of her pies.

Maxine is survived by her two sons and their wives, David and Linda Lampel of Winterset, Iowa, and Terry and Patricia Lampel of Everett, Washington. Also surviving are three grandchildren, Kristina Wilson (Kipp), of Kenosha, Wisconsin, Michael Lampel (Ikuyo), of Seri Begawan, Bandar Brunei, and Sarah Lampel, of Ingleside, Illinois-and four great-grandchildren, Elisabeth and Noah Wilson, and Thee and Olivia Lampel.
