## OBITUARY

## Yekum.

John A. Tokom, who has been critically ill for several weeks of tuberuilosis of the lungs, died at his home, 51x North Third street at 7 o'clock Saturday night. Mr. Tokom had been ill for three years and returned to the city only last November from a trip to northern Nebrasks and the Rlack Hills where he had gone in the hopes of being benefited. Two years ago, shortly after his condition had been realised, he made another western trip, but neither resulted in much improvement in his health.

Mr. Yokom was born at Cotk's Mills, Oritario, Can. May 6, 1867. When a lad in 1863 his parents, Mr. and Mrs. E. N. Yokom, came to this county, locating on a farm at Hayne's Grova. Mr. Yokom lived there until he wes 20 years of age, when he was married to Miss Emma Richeson, then of Ederiville, now the town of Rhodes. Mr. Yokom and his young wife took pos-session of a farm near Melbourne immediately after their marriage, and lived there for a few years, when they went to State Center where they lived four years. From State Center they moved to Nebrasks, where Mr. Yokom was on the road, Residences in Holt, Fillmore, Phelps and York countles were made wntil 1893, when they moved to this city where they have since lived. Mr. Yokom has been following carpentering during most of his residence here, or until him health became such that he was unable to

work at his trade. Mr. Yokom is survived by a family composed of his wife and three children, two sons and one daughter. The sons are G. Ashton Tokom, of Minneapolis, and Clarence E. Yokom of this city, and the daughter, Mrs. Harry Hotchkias, of this city. Two sisters, Mrs. Wellington W. Woods, of Cambridge, and Mrs. Della Horton, of St. Louis also survive the deceased. The funeral was held from the residence this afternoon at 2 e'clock, Chaplain Jesse Cole, of the Soldiers Home avsisted by Rev. Dr. C. L. Gould, oniciating. Interment followed an Riverside Mr. Ashton Yokom arrived from Minneapolis Friday merning, in sesponse to the telegram announcing his father's death.
